# Sermonlater...

1. If you were asked, "What is the reason you live (what do you live for)?" You probably would answer without hesitation that, "I live for God!"

- i. Why do you live for God? What is(are) the reasons why you live for God?
- ii. As for the Apostle Paul, he eagerly expects and hopes that he will in no way be ashamed, but will have sufficient courage so that now as always Christ will be exalted in his body, whether by life or by death. For to him, to live is Christ and to die is gain. (cf. Philippians 1:20-21)

Share with one another as you compare and contrast your reason(s) to live with Paul's reason(s) to live.

Share how the way Paul lived his life for Christ inspires you to live for Christ.

## 2. Relate Vertically: Human and God Relationship

- i. When Jesus was asked, "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" He replied, "Love the Lord your God with ALL your heart and with ALL your soul and with ALL your mind."

Compare the word "ALL" in Jesus' response with the first 4 commandments, what expectation(s) does God have for us? Why? (cf. Matthew 22:36-37)

- ii. Both Matthew 22:37 and the first 4 commandments of Exodus 20:3-11 pointed to a G\_\_\_ - C\_\_\_\_\_ed Living

## 3. Relate Horizontally: Human and Human Relationship

- i. The second part of Jesus' response to the question, "which is the greatest commandment in the Law" was "Love your neighbor as YOURSELF"! Jesus chose "Love your neighbor as 'YOURSELF'" in relation to the final 6 commandments in Exodus 20:12-17. Why didn't Jesus ask us to "Love our neighbor as 'HIMSELF/ Jesus'"? What has this told you about God's expectation for us how we should relate with our fellow human? Why? (cf. Matthew 22:39; John 13:34-35)

- ii. Both Matthew 22:39 and the final 6 commandments of Exodus 20:12-17 points to a O\_\_\_\_\_ - C\_\_\_\_\_ed Living
