What does this verse imply about the relationship between faith and action? Why should we be concerned about someone who does not act on what they profess to believe?
- 5. Are there any commands or promises of Jesus that you find particularly challenging to believe or obey? What do you think is the reason for this difficulty? What difference would it make in your life if you could exercise more faith in this area?
