- 3. What is the connection between worshipping God and loving God with all our heart, soul, and strength? Have you ever tried to worship God without loving God? How effective was that worship?
- 4. What do you do when you don't have the strength to love God fully? What measures have you found that are effective at restoring the strength of your love for God?
- 5. What does it say about God that He has taken the initiative to reconcile all things to Himself through Jesus (Colossians 1:20)? When you experience the need for reconciliation in your life, how often are you the one to initiate? What sacrifices have you found to be necessary to achieve true reconciliation?
